MDX Announces Election Results of Board of Directors Executive Officers

MIAMI – June 27, 2018 – MDX announces the results of the 2018-2019 election of executive officers for its Board of Directors. Mayor Carlos Gimenez was elected as Chair of the MDX Board of Directors.
